This study adopts a qualitative case study approach focused on Adecco India Pvt Ltd.

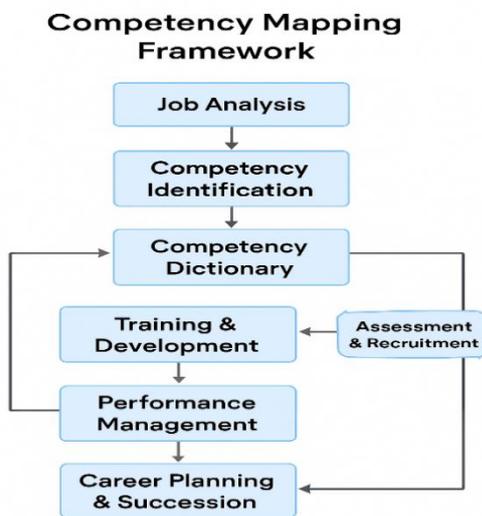
## 3.1 Data Sources
